Religious discontent is indistinguishable from the history of spiritual renewal and awakening.

Religion is often characterised as contentment, the idea that faith and faithfulness offer peace, security and certainty. In this mode God is depicted in kindly ways, the church as an escape from the cares and stresses of the world, and religious leaders as pastors, the spiritual caretakers of the flock.

Although most faith traditions do offer such surety to believers, religion has another guise as well – the prophetic tradition. In the prophetic mode, faith discomforts the members of a community, opens their eyes and hearts to the shortcomings of their own lives and injustice in the world, and presses for human society to more fully embody God's dream of healing and love for all peoples.

Religious faiths struggle between the pastoral and the prophetic, comfort and agitation.

In a very real way institutions are inherently pastoral – they seek to maintain those things that give comfort by baptising shared values and virtues of a community. They reinforce the way things are (or were) through the appeals to divine or supernatural order. They are always slow to change.

Institutions resist prophets. Prophet's question. They push for things to be different. They push people to behave better toward one another. They want change.

The history of Christianity can be told as a story of the tension between order and prophecy.

Spiritual outbursts almost always precede real reform. Might spiritual discontent be today's prophetic edge, needing institutions to listen, to change, to be more responsive and relevant? Are the rumblings signs of some new form of faith?

Sunday Obligation	Please remember that, during this next stage of the COVID pandemic, the obligation to attend Mass on a Sunday has been lifted. You may decide, therefore, to attend Mass through the week instead of at the weekend.				
Covid 19 Update	 From Monday 19th July the country moved to level 0 with regard to Covid restrictions. This obviously meant a number of changes as to how we celebrate Mass. These changes took effect from 19th July: Social distancing is reduced from 2m to 1m. This means more people can be accommodated at Mass in both St Matthew's and Our Lady of Mount Carmel. In both Churches, the capacity will be around 85-90. Even with this increased capacity, we are able to maintain a high level of hygiene and safety. Recognising the increased capacity in St. Matthew's, the Saturday Vigil Mass will be discontinued from this weekend onwards. It was always a temporary measure during Covid to accommodate people wanting to attend restricted Masses; A booking system for Sunday Masses will still be in place (at least for the next few weeks) to see how people are accommodated under the new guidelines; There will be a Saturday morning 10am Mass in St. Matthew's each week; Mask wearing will continue and all hygiene and sanitising protocols remain in place; Since there may be further easing of restrictions from the government, some time in the future, these current arrangements will be kept under review 				
Booking a Place at Mass	You can book a seat at Mass in the following ways a) Each week from the Sunday evening at 6pm, you can book a seat online through the Parish website for either of the two Sunday Masses; b) For those who do not have access to online booking, on the following Friday afternoon from 5pm and 6pm, parishioners will be able to phone in and book a seat. The number is: 07847 726 845 (please do not text this number to book, please use the website or call as above).				
Coming Back to Mass	With the further easing of restrictions, Fr. Martin is encouraging all parishioners to think about coming to Mass IN PERSON.
