REQUIESCANT IN PACE: Our parishioners Francis (Frank) Farren, and Winifred (Freda) Kirkwood have died: may they rest in peace. The Requiem Mass for Francis Farren will be celebrated on Friday 14th April at 10 am. The Requiem Mass for Winifred Kirkwood will be celebrated on Tuesday 18th April at 10 am.

RECOVERING LITURGICAL PRACTICES RESTRICTED BY THE PANDEMIC: While most liturgical practices have been restored as we exit the pandemic, there are two which have remained restricted: the physical handshake of peace and the reception of Communion from the chalice. Easter is a moment of new life and new beginnings. Since by Easter we are moving out of winter with less possibility of spreading respiratory viruses, Easter 2023 seems to be a pragmatic and symbolic moment to reinstate these last two restricted practices. From last Sunday, you were invited to share peace using the handshake, and from Holy Thursday the opportunity to drink from the chalice was reinstated for those who choose. Intinction (the "dipping" of the host in the chalice) is not permitted: those who wish to receive the Precious Blood should drink from the chalice. The sacred host may also be received on the tongue.

PARISH DINNER TO MARK THE 175th ANNIVERSARY YEAR: A dinner will take place in the church hall on **Friday 28th April** at 7.00 pm for 7.30 pm to celebrate the 175th anniversary year. A three-course meal will be served and there will be live music. Tables will be arranged to seat eight people and if you wish to book a full table or add more people, please indicate this when buying tickets. Tickets are on sale from the shop in the porch, cost £20. **Raffle prizes will be gratefully received.**

SOCIETY FOR THE PROTECTION OF UNBORN CHILDREN (SPUC): There are two existing major threats against life in Scotland. Firstly, Gillian McKay MSP is introducing a Bill to introduce so called buffer zones around abortion clinics which will prevent peaceful prayer groups gathering to pray for unborn children and to provide hope for women who want to keep their baby but feel they have no other choice than abortion. Secondly, at the other end of life, Liam McArthur MSP is planning to table a Bill to legalise assisted suicide.

SPUC has resources at the back of the church and also online at www.spuc.org.uk/Get-Involved/Campaigns with information about how to contact MSPs. Many MSPs are undecided on these issues and pressure from constituents can make a real difference.

SOLEMN BLESSING AND DEDICATION

The 1903 Harrison & Harrison organ, restored for Easter 2023, will be solemnly blessed and dedicated using the traditional French Blessing of a Pipe Organ whereby the organist improvises eight themes in response to invocations for the organ to sing the praises of God and honour the mysteries of salvation.

Followed by an inaugural recital also by Andrew Reid.

To celebrate the restoration of the Harrison and Harrison (1903) pipe organ, the Mass of **Sunday 16th April** (a week after Easter) will be celebrated in thanksgiving. The choir will sing with the organ at Mass.

Thank you for all your support towards the remarkable achievement of restoring this instrument which has left an indelible musical impression on the souls of generations of parishioners during the last 120 years. The organ has fittingly accompanied the Holy Week and Easter liturgies as a symphonic expression of the Resurrection!

DEFIBRILLATOR TRAINING: A defibrillator has been installed beside the door of the church hall. The location was chosen so that, as well as being able to be used in any emergency when people are gathered in the church and in the hall, it could also be available to the wider public should there be an emergency in the more public vicinity of the church.

Margaret McGrath will deliver training on the use of the defibrillator on Sunday 16th April in the hall after 11 am Mass (i.e. around 12.00 noon). The training is for parishioners who wish to have the skills to assist in a cardiac emergency while paramedic support is awaited. It would be good to have a number of people at every Mass who have had this training. If you would like more information please speak to Margaret McGrath (or call her on 01563 542130). PILGRIMAGE TO IONA: This year Our Lady of Mount Carmel will celebrate its 60th Jubilee. To mark this occasion, we are planning a day's pilgrimage to Iona on Saturday 22nd April. Parishioners from St Joseph's are very welcome to join us. The coach will leave Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church around 6.00 am and return just after 10.00 pm. We will have approximately 5 hours on the island with Mass in the Abbey at 3.00 pm. There will be several hours free to explore the Abbey precincts, the burial place of Scottish kings and the fine beaches on the island, all within easy walking distance. APPEAL FOR FOOD PARCELS: We appeal again for food parcels to be delivered to the church to maintain supply. The contents of the food parcel are specific and are to be delivered in a strong plastic or paper bag:

- 2 cans of soup
- 1 canned meal, e.g. beef bolognese, chilli con carne, chicken supreme, Fray Bentos style pie
- 1 pack of either pasta, tinned potatoes, rice
- 1 tin of fruit
- 1 tin of vegetables
- 1 tin of beans
- 1 carton of long-life milk (UHT)
- 1 tin of hotdog sausages
- 1 tin of sardines/mackerel fillets/tuna
- 1 packet of biscuits
- 1 toilet roll and 1 bar of soap.

Please ensure canned foods **have a ring pull** for opening. Please also note that tea, coffee and sugar are **not required**. Please deliver the parcels to the church hall on **Wednesday between 11 am and 12 noon**. Alternatively, they can be brought to Mass or left in the front porch of the church house.
